#### **MAJOR RESEARCH INTERESTS:**

Initially at UAB my research interests focused on molecular epidemiology of drug resistance in malaria and in malaria and protozoan parasite intermediary metabolism with the intent of identifying therapeutic drug targets. In the late 1990s I added the focus of clinical based research in HIV-infected or at-risk youth in the US. This continues to be a significant focus with protocol activity and research on primary prevention (community-based, behavioral and biomedical), management and treatment of HIV infected youth, metabolic complications of HIV and antiretroviral therapy, and also on secondary prevention and risk reduction. I reengaged international programs in 1998 focused on expanded access to HIV medications, care and management and prevention of HIV in resource poor settings as well as education and development of the health care workforce. These activities have been predominantly focused in Zambia but activities have expanded into Ethiopia and the Caribbean.
